Warning if you reside within pinal coutny you are at risk of loosing your rights to horses and livestock. Current zoning put into place June 18th of 1962 calls for unlimited number of large animals for suburban ranch and general rural zones. Hearing is slated for Oct 19th 2007 in Florence to reduce that number to 2 large animals per acre. Large animals are inclusive of goats, sheep, cattle, horses.

This marks the end of of a way of life for many pinal residents and small ranchers. You can find info at;

The purpose of this Article is to provide for low density single family residential use with limited agricultural uses.

Sec. 2002 USES PERMITTED.

The following uses and their accessory uses are permitted SUBJECT TO THE GENERAL REGULATIONS SET FORTH THROUGHOUT THIS ORDINANCE:

2002.2 Agricultural or horticulture, not for retail sales, including any number of poultry, rabbits and similar small animals. Only two large animals more than six (6) months of age per acre are allowed, such as cattle, horses, sheep or goats.

ARTICLE 16 RU-2 RURAL ZONE – 2 ACRES

Sec. 1601 PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Article is to provide for very low density residential use and to conserve other open land uses.

Sec. 1602 USES PERMITTED.

The following uses and their accessory uses are permitted SUBJECT TO THE GENERAL REGULATIONS SET FORTH THROUGHOUT THIS ORDINANCE:

1602.2 Agricultural or horticulture, not for retail sales, including any number of poultry, rabbits and similar small animals. Only two large animals more than six (6) months of age per acre are allowed, such as cattle, horses, sheep or goats.
